

Starliving Waterfront



The dissipating pavement pattern is a reference to wave movement - shifting sands and receding water, a subtle reference to the waterside context.



The landscape design for this high rise development on the Dubai waterfront is established through the strong geometry of the built form and a high level of integration between the Architectural and Landscape spaces.

The use of pedestrian shelters and vine trellises on the Ground Floor and Level 1 provides a changing shade pattern from dappled light to full shade for maximum pedestrian amenity. Typically the vine plantings include colourful Bougainvillea and scented Jasmine. Integrated with trees, planting areas and lawn, the pedestrian trellis structures aim to soften the scale of the public plaza, provide shade and act as a heat collector. The common designed elements within the ground floor public plaza landscape and the upper private podium landscape cleverly integrates the experience of the life lived outdoors, in both the public and private realms.
